The DEIC worked on a statement to send to the Acton Boxborough Region School Committee. The statement is as follows:

Acton's Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Commission's Statement Concerning the Acton-Boxborough Regional High School Mascot:

Acton's DEIC recommends the removal of the Colonial mascot.

A mascot, by definition, exists to unite and represent a community, foster belonging and promote sportsmanship. The Colonial mascot of the Acton-Boxborough Regional School District fails to do this on all counts. The Colonial represents a history of injustice to the Nipmuc Nation, whose land the town was built upon. The demographics of the town of Acton are shifting to a reflection of different races and ethnic backgrounds, and with this we've seen new perspectives on previous issues. Put simply, the mascot does not represent the inhabitants of the Town of Acton. All students should feel centered, supported, and included within a school community.

This statement comes at a time of national and global conversations about racist stereotypes and symbols of oppression; as a commission, in creating our statement, we decided to focus on the communities directly affected by these symbols, namely the ancestors of the natives whose ascendants were murdered, raped and ousted from these lands.

Acton's DEIC acknowledges the history of injustice perpetrated against the Nipmuc tribe and stands in solidarity with their fight to be seen, heard and accurately represented in the town.
