I. New Business

1. SB 5/9 meeting agenda highlights- the Selectboard approved the Acton Dog Park Committee's updated charter. The sewer extension continues to be reviewed as an option. The town and Selectboard are exploring a Mass Grant due on June 1st and

- will know by September 1st if awarded. The priority would be the sewer. There is some opposition to using the funding for the sewer.
2. Parking thoughts-There are many unanswered questions in regard to parking. The committee agreed a smaller group with all stakeholders will meet to address parking issues.
 3. Design work – next steps. Engineering has developed a design for the dog park parcel to include a 10 by 10 pump house. The committee had concerns on its location. Next step is to check on the status of the pump house location and address sewer and parking issues. Tom will meet with Dennis and engineering.
