### 1. Assabet River Blue and Green Trail

Park at Old High Street Trailhead; proceed 150' down the trail and turn left onto the boardwalk. Look for birds and wildlife. Maybe go fishing (with a valid Mass. Fishing license if over age 15)!

### 2. Acton Arboretum

Explore the upper grounds self-guided tour sites with the green, numbered circles

### 3. Camp Acton

Visit Campsite one, which has an accessible boardwalk, fire pit and picnic table. If you want to stay overnight, please get a permit from the Recreation Dept. 978-929-6640.

### 4. Great Hill

Park behind the fire station on School Street. Proceed straight ahead along the trees on the left to the pond. Sit at one of the benches and enjoy the view of the pond.

### 5. Nashoba Brook

Park at the end of Wheeler Lane. There is an accessible walkway through a kiosk with information panels and a picnic table. Maybe bring lunch. Try to identify wildlife and plants. Enjoy!

### **6.Robbins Mill**

Park at 61 Canterbury Hill Road and visit the playground. Try and identify some birds.

### **7.Assabet River Rail Trail**

(Park on Martin Street and walk at least 2 miles)

### **8.Bruce Freeman Rail Trail**

(Walk at least 2 miles, many parking options)
