TOWN MANAGER'S UPDATE

In celebration of the Kelley's Corner infrastructure improvement project construction that is slated to begin this Fall, the Economic Development and Recreation offices are hosting a Block Party on Saturday, September 10th from 2 to 4 PM. There will be live music, face painting and crafts, pickle ball, and various tents from community vendors and partners. Parking will be located at the K-Mart plaza. Please contact the Economic Development Office with any questions by calling 978-929-6611 or visiting actonma.gov/business.

Acton Power Choice, which is a collective purchasing program for the community's electricity supply, will have a few modifications beginning this month. In response to Acton's climate goals, the program increases the amount of supply from renewable energy sources from 30% to 60% within the "APC Standard" tier, which is the program most residents will be auto-enrolled in. "APC Green," which sources from 100% renewable energy, is still available for residents to opt-in. Residents may still opt-down to APC Basic, which is the most affordable tier sourcing from 20% renewable energy sources. This program will also come with new electricity supply rates, as shown the graphic below. If you have any questions on this program, please visit actonpowerchoice.com or call 844-379-9933.





**Important Information**

-If possible, please only make **ONE** trip to Hazardous Waste Day. Upon entering the site, please drive slow and stay in your vehicle.

-Please read the below lists of what to and not to bring. Many materials can now be dropped off year round at Town of Acton facilities.

-Transfer Station sticker or recycling only sticker required to drop the below materials at the Transfer Station.

-Recycling sticker is only \$15 annually (\$10 for seniors 65+)

WHAT TO BRING:

Please bring household hazardous waste in sealed containers (use original containers when possible)

- Oil paints, stains, thinners & strippers
- Solvents, varnishes
- Adhesives, glues, resins
- Waste fuels, contaminated waste oil
- Engine degreaser, brake Fluid
- Transmission fluid, antifreeze
- Insecticides, weed killers, pesticides
- Wood preservatives
- Hobby supplies, artist supplies
- Photo chemicals, chemistry sets
- Cleaners, spot removers
- Swimming pool chemicals
- Aerosol cans

What can be brought to Acton Facilities NOT to Hazardous Waste Day:

Note: Town Hall hours are M,W, Thurs. 8-5; Tues 8-7:30; & Fri 8-12 noon

- Fluorescent light bulbs (Transfer Station—Recycling sticker required)
- Television's and CRT's (Transfer Station) -There is a \$25 fee per unit
- Uncontaminated waste oil (Transfer Station)
- Lithium ion, Nickel-Cadmium, Lead acid batteries (Transfer Station or Town Hall)
- Car batteries (Transfer Station)
- Hearing Aid/Button Cell batteries (Town Hall)
- Sharps, Hypodermic Needles (Transfer Station, Public Safety Building & Nursing Department)
- Fire extinguishers (Transfer Station)


What NOT to bring:

- Alkaline Batteries (dispose of in regular trash)
- Latex Paint (open, add hardener to expedite drying, throw away)
- Smoke Detectors (dispose of in regular trash)
- Asbestos (call a Licensed Asbestos Contractor)
- Compressed gas cylinders
- Ammunition, fireworks, explosives
- Commercial or industrial waste
- Infectious & biological waste
- Radioactive waste
- Oil filters (punch hole in dome, drain for 24 hours, save oil for recycling, put in trash after draining)

To Ensure Safety, Please:

- **During event, drive slow and follow cones to avoid an accident.**
- Tighten caps and lids leaving materials in original containers.
- Pack containers in sturdy upright boxes and pad with newspaper.

- Sort and pack separately: paint, pesticides, household cleaners.
- Avoid spills and do not place in a garbage bag.
- Never mix chemicals, and never smoke while handling chemicals.
- Pack your vehicle and go directly to the site.
