

TOWN MANAGER'S UPDATE

I hope everyone had a relaxing summer. Below are some brief updates on some of the projects we have implemented recently. Acton continues to be a very busy place this fall. Please review the following pages for upcoming events and programs that are happening in the area.

Removal of Hazardous Dam on River Street: We started the project to remove the River Street dam and site work has been going well. The project is scheduled to be completed in the next few months and once funding is secured we will begin work on creating the planned historic park to celebrate the industrial history of South Acton.

Renovation of Gardner Field is nearly completed: The playground equipment has been installed and is available for use while we complete the site work and other landscaping around the park.

Renovation of Elm Street Tennis Courts: We completed the reconstruction of the Elm Street Tennis courts. In the photo in the next page you will see that they also are painted as pickle ball courts.

New Online Permitting: On August 10th we launched online permitting which has streamlined processes for your convenience and helped us improve efficiency. If you wish to submit a building permit including gas, plumbing, mechanical and electrical permits, please go to <https://acton-ma.gov/permit> to create an account.

New Taxi service available: We are launching a pilot program called Acton Rides to utilize a taxi service as a supplement to our existing local transportation services. Eligible residents will be able to secure rides through the same dispatch service that handles the rest of our transportation options. Please contact transportation@actonma.gov to learn more about the program and eligibility requirements.

Cone with a Cop: As part of a collaboration with the Acton Police Department and the office of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion we held a “Cone with a Cop” event on August 28th. Officers visited several residential areas along Great Road accompanied by an ice cream truck. We gave out about 300 cones to children and families and had an opportunity to meet and speak with several community members.

Body Camera Pilot: Acton Police is beginning a new body camera program. Five of our officers are currently testing body cameras, with plans to expand this program further with funding approved at the 2023 Annual Town Meeting.

New Bike Share Program: We are excited to announce the launch of the Minuteman Bike Share in Acton! In line with the Town's sustainability goals, Acton and Concord have partnered to host a bike share program including four bike share stations across the two Towns.

New Senior Café: We have created a warm and welcoming space for our seniors to connect, share stories, and enjoy some great company. Stay tuned for announcements about the café being available to the general public later this fall.




WHAT IS YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID?

Regulations & Safety

Regulations

- All residents must stay in their vehicles AT ALL TIMES
- Waste ONLY accepted from truck bed, trunk of car, or back hatch of SUV
- Clean Harbors will not be returning any containers (gas containers, storage totes, etc.)
- If possible, make one trip to Household Hazardous Waste Day

Safety

- Drive SLOW through site and follow cones to avoid an accident
- Tighten all caps and lids
- Pack containers in sturdy upright boxes and pad with newspaper
- Sort and pack separately: paint, pesticides, household cleaners
- Avoid spills and do not place hazardous items in a garbage bag
- Never mix chemicals, and never smoke while handling chemicals
- Pack your vehicle and go directly to the site

What Can you Bring to Household Hazardous Waste Day?

**Noted Historian Prof. Robert Allison
Inaugurates the Acton 250 Lecture Series**

***From Crown Tensions to Tea Parties:
The Role of Massachusetts in Shaping the Revolution***

Starting this fall, the Acton 250 Committee will sponsor a series of lectures on the history leading up to the momentous events of 1775 and 1776. The lectures will help us understand what life was like in our community in that era and share the less told stories of residents.

Please join us on September 21 at 7:30PM at Acton Town Hall for the inaugural lecture. We are thrilled to feature Professor Robert Allison, who will discuss the pivotal events that set the stage for the Boston Tea Party and sparked the American Revolution.

Prof. Allison is renowned for his expertise in American colonial history, and the political, social, and economic factors that converged in the 18th century, leading to the climactic moment in Boston's history. He has taught history at Suffolk University since 1992, when he received his doctorate at Harvard. He is currently the Chair of *Revolution 250*, a consortium of organizations planning commemorations of the Revolution's 250th anniversary and a life-trustee of the USS Constitution Museum.



Acton's Select Board approved the use of ARPA funds to **support energy efficiency improvements for businesses** as part of the the Acton Business and Energy Efficiency Grant Program (ABEEG).
